Equally noteworthy is his representation of technology companies, helping them protect their intellectual property—patents, trademarks and copyrights—through both preventive measures and, when necessary, litigation.

“It’s a great privilege to be joining the Coalition board alongside other dedicated individuals focused on helping to solve the crisis of homelessness in our community,” commented Toscano.

Within the community, Toscano has served on the board of directors of the Second Harvest Food Bank and the associate board of directors of Florida Citrus Sports. He has provided hundreds of hours of pro bono work, including serving as a Guardian Ad Litem for children in difficult family circumstances in need of legal representation. At the firm, he also orchestrates workplace campaigns to raise money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, United Way, the Meredith Level Foundation/Endowment, and other community and civic organizations.
